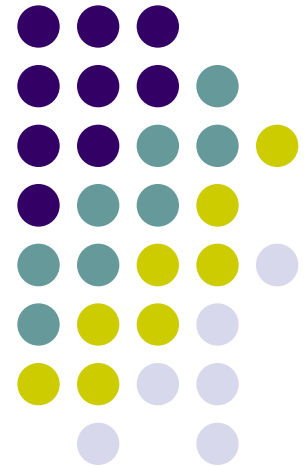


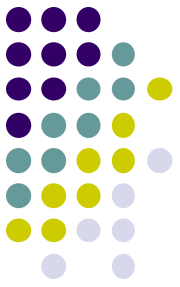

# FY12 Achievements To Date



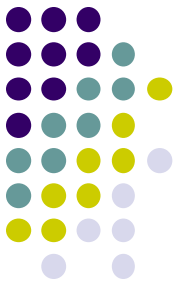
- Initiated a white paper on pre-approved subcontractors in prime contractor proposals

# Best Practices Development Status and Plans for FY12

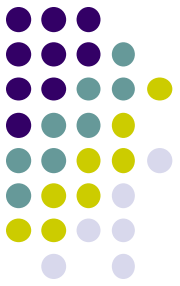
