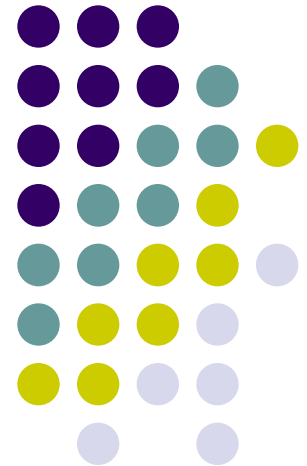


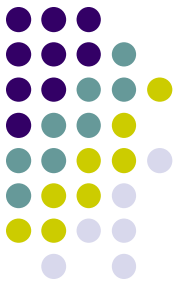

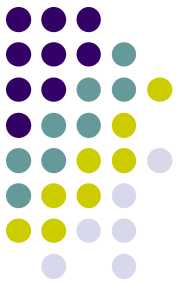

Purpose

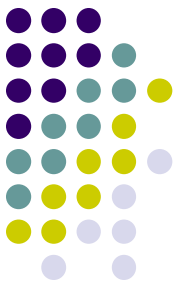


- The Energy Facilities Contractor Group (EFCOG) has been requested by the Department of Energy to provide assistance in evaluating and providing suggestions to improve and provide site-wide consistency to the current Request for Equitable Adjustment (REA)/change process for Environmental Management (EM) contracts (non M&O).
- While targeted at FAR Part 15 (non-M&O contracts) data is welcome from other contractors



Issues

- DOE perceives problems with EM Contractors not following FAR Part 15 (NOTE: Part 15 is used as a term to designate a non-M&O prime contract that typically has a negotiated and mutually agreed estimated cost and fees are negotiated and earned through performance incentives).

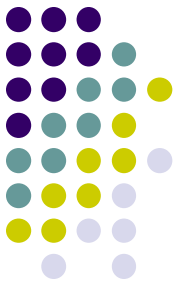


Specific Issues

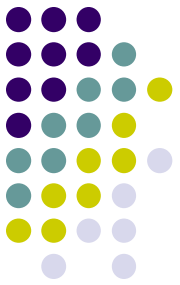
- Large Requests for Equitable Adjustments
- Delays in approvals
- Disagreements between Federal Staff and Contractors
- Project/contract baseline variances
- Disconnects between contract changes and baseline changes
- Conflicting guidance from field offices and HQ

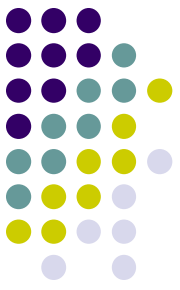

Process

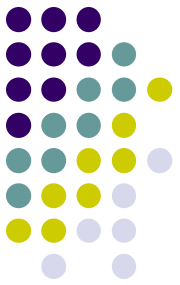
- Develop survey
- Comments from EM and EFCOG Board
- Identify survey recipients (35 EFCOG Member Companies*)
- Send letter and survey to recipient-5/28-Poor Response
- Resent with extension to 7/28 (5 surveys returned to date)

*List expanded when resent



Process cont'd.

- Team to review and categorize responses
Confidentiality will maintained
- Draft white paper report of results and proposed suggestions for improvement
- Run draft white paper through EFCOG Board of Director for review and comments
- Finalize white paper
- Submit through EFCOG Board to DOE EM (Jack Surash)
