

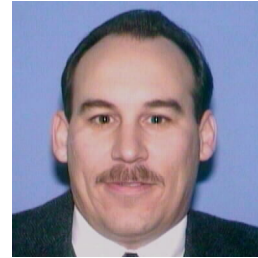

PROFESSIONAL PROFILE

Mr. Crowe is an employee of the Office of Health, Safety and Security and was reassigned in March 2007 to serve as the Director, Office of Security Enforcement.



Mr. Crowe has over 25 years of professional security experience while assigned to the Department and other government agencies. His initial security experience was developed by managing security programs while on active duty with the United States Air Force for eight years. He accepted his appointment to civil service at China Lake Naval Weapons Center, California as the lead physical security specialist conducting security inspections relative to the protection of classified matter and locations containing arms, ammunition, and explosives.

In 1990, he transferred to the Department of Energy's Idaho Operations Office and initially served as a personnel security specialist and successfully established the Idaho National Laboratory's human reliability program. After approximately three years, he was promoted and reassigned to security operations and served as the manager for the information security and the foreign ownership, control and influence programs.

Upon his promotion and transfer to the Office of Security Evaluations, DOE-Headquarters in 1999, Mr. Crowe served as the team lead for the classified matter protection and control program and conducted in-depth security inspections of nuclear and non-nuclear facilities throughout the complex. Additionally, he has served as the lead and supported fact-finding teams in response to highly visible and embarrassing security events involving classified information. In 2002, he developed and managed a first-of-a-kind oversight program to assess the Department's special access programs. He efficiently structured the inspection activities to assess the security and compartmentalization of these sensitive programs activities and information, to include the integration of protection program management, protective force, physical security systems, personnel security, classified matter protection and control, cyber security, and specific program security requirements.

Mr. Crowe has successfully completed several security courses at the National Training Center, including the Department's technical qualification program (93-3) in 1997 and received his Bachelors of Science Degree from Idaho State University.
